### THE GOOD NEWS: SUMMARY OF ACHIEVEMENT 2015-17

#### Students in Care

Over the last 3 years, our 7 Students in Care have made outstanding progress across all 3 core subjects:

- Our Mean Student in Care has progressed by an outstanding average of 2.6 sub-levels in each core subject every year: in English, his progress was good at 2.1 sub-levels; in Maths and Science, his progress was outstanding at 2.9 and 2.6 sub-levels, respectively.
- Four students (57%) made outstanding progress overall: one student made outstanding progress across all 3 core subjects, and 2 students made outstanding progress in 2 of them; one student made good progress across all 3 subject, and another across 2 of them.

#### Students on Pupil Premium

Our 24 students on Pupil Premium, have made remarkably consistent, approximately good, progress (1.8 sub-levels per subject per year); overall and mean scores are somewhat lowered by the moderating effect of entering some students for Maths GCSE in Year 9 and almost all in Year 10.

- 11 students (46%) made good or outstanding progress, overall; this would probably rise to 14 (58%) if Maths progress was measured against NC, rather than through early-entry GCSE results.
- 19 students (79%) made good or outstanding progress in one or more core subject.
- 12 students (50%) made outstanding progress in one or more core subject.
- 6 students (25%) made good or outstanding progress across all 3 core subjects.

#### Key Stage 4

Across the last 3 years, although the overall KS4 point score per student has fluctuated due to varying take-up of other point scoring qualifications, the mean core subject point score has stayed very consistent at around 25.5 points per student per core subject; even with the introduction in 2017 of harder 9-1 GCSEs in English and Maths, the mean point score per student per core subject was still 23.4. Moreover, for the current Year 11:

- 70% of students already have a Maths GCSE, with a mean point score of 26.3: this should rise significantly with another year of teaching before their final exam.
- There is a wider take-up of other point scoring qualifications.

### **Key Stage 3**

Across the last 3 years there has been a significant improvement by students completing KS3:

- In 2015, all students made only moderate mean progress across the core subjects; in 2017 64% made good or outstanding mean progress.
- In 2015, 38% made good progress in English, 88% good or outstanding progress in Maths and 12% in Science; in 2017, these figures were 64%, 73% and 64% respectively.
- In 2015, the Mean Student made good progress in only one core subject (Maths); in 2017, the Mean Student made good progress across all 3 core subjects.
